- **The Policy Front: They took my mic and called security on me,** yet I outmaneuvered the African Union's machinery in the brutal fight for Africa's digital future.
- **The Global Digital Front:** As the only woman applicant, they labeled me **SHE.Africa**, yet I prevailed in a landmark victory (IRP) against ICANN — rewriting the rules of global Internet governance.
- **The Cultural Front: They said SHE spoke out.** I started the first women-in-tech seed fund in Africa (Miss.Africa Digital), now impacting 15 countries.
